Work in Progress

Editor, *Presidential Addresses of the American Philosophical Association, 1901–2000*, an 11-volume series (commissioned). The American Philosophical Association Board of Officers has accepted my proposal to be Editor in Chief of this series. The series is intended to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the APA, and to be a major resource for 21st century scholars wishing to work in the history of 20th century American Philosophy. Each volume will cover a ten year period. For the eleventh volume, scholars will be commissioned to write critical historical essays for each decade, aiming at characterizations of the general philosophical spirit of the decade in which the presidential addresses were given. Each address will be preceded by a photograph of the individual followed by a biographical sketch by the editor.
